The **Copenhagen Summer Festival** is approaching!

From **Sunday 28th of July – 8. August** the city of Copenhagen will host young talents and the elite of awards winners from all over the world. Concerts will be held every day in the beautiful Charlottenborgs Festsal, where the highly profiled young musicians will present classical chamber music pieces.

On the opening concert on the **28th of July**, the 16-year-old violinist **Mira Foron**, who represented Germany in the finals of the Eurovision Young Musicians 2018 contest, will perform the Sonate KV 454, B-dur of W.A. Mozart, the Sonate F-dur, "Forårssonaten", op. 24 of L. Van Beethoven and the Tzigane of Maurice Ravel.

On the **1st of August** the Cello-Piano duo with young prizewinners from some of the most important music competitions in the world will perform. The cellist Victor Julien-Lafferrière, winner of the Queen Elisabeth Competition 2017 and the pianist **Theo Fouchenneret**, winner of the Geneva Competition 2018 will bring on stage musics of Felix Mendelssohn-Bartholdy, Leos Janacek, Jean-Frederic Neuburger and Igor Stravinsky.

Remember to save the date for the concert of the **Orbis Quartet**! Founded in March 2014, after only a few months the ensemble won the second prize in the category of chamber music at the Johannes Brahms international competition in Pörschach (Austria). In September 2015 they won first prize as well as the special prize of the city of Kraków at the International Beethoven Chamber Music Competition in Poland in the string quartet category. On the **2nd of August** the Orbis Quartet will perform in Copenhagen.
